Psi Chi, the International Honor Society in Psychology, was founded in 1929 with a mission to encourage excellence in scholarship and advance the science of psychology. More than three-quarters of a million lifetime members have joined including Distinguished Members (https://www.psichi.org/?Dist_Members) such as Drs. Albert Bandura, B. F. Skinner, and Phillip Zimbardo. A few popular Membership Benefits (https://www.psichi.org/?page=member_benefits) include international recognition for academic excellence, as well as access to psychology-related publications (https://www.psichi.org/?page=news) and more than \$400,000 in annual awards and grants (https://www.psichi.org/?page=awards).

After potential members are approved by a local faculty advisor, all 1,250+ Psi Chi chapters process their new members on our online system.
